

PSALM 119 Study Questions/Helps #2

These verses have blessed and shaped my thinking and thereby, my life; they continue to do so even to this day:

vv. 9-11: "Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed thereto according to Your word. . . ." (KJV)

v. 18: "Open Thou mine eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of Thy law."

v. 67: "Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I have kept Thy Word."

v. 71: "It was good for me that I have been afflicted, that I might learn Thy statutes."

v. 89: "Forever, O LORD, Thy Word is settled in heaven."

v. 97: "Oh, how I love Thy law! It is my meditation all the day."

v. 105: "Thy Word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my path."

v. 130: "The unfolding (KJV 'entrance') of Your Words gives light; it imparts understanding to the simple."
