Eph. 1:3-14: A Helpful Way to Be Strong in the LORD: Serving Our SAVIOR, Prepared and Equipped

A. God directed Moses to teach the people of Israel a Song (poetic verse) before they entered the Promised Land, one they were to always remember (Deut. 32).

<u>Paul's opening Hymn of Praise that begins Ephesians is one that all Christians</u> would do well to learn, to know, to remember, and regularly ponder. WHY?

- * There are MANY spiritual truths the Spirit has packed into this "Hymn of Praise."
- * Isaiah 7:9; "If you are not firm in faith, you will not be firm at all."
- 1. Paul's hymn comprises **one sentence**; that is, it's all contained in <u>one unit of</u> thought.
- 2. **Praise** to *God the Father* both <u>begins</u> and <u>ends</u> the Hymn.
- 3. All **3 Persons of the Godhead** participate in the work of Salvation (Trinity) (God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit).
- 4. Salvation's story stretches from **eternity to eternity**: from past (before the creation v.4) to eternity future (*fullness of time* v.10; and then beyond).
- 5. **Christ** is the center of all God has done and will do; the one "<u>in Christ</u>" has everything; the one who is not, has nothing.
- 6. God's greatest blessings and life's foremost blessings are NOT material but **spiritual blessings**; they are not earthly and temporary, but in the "heavenlies" and eternal. In the hymn Paul recounts them one after another.
- 7. God's glorious grace exalts His glory and issues in endless PRAISE to Him. The marvelous expanse of **God's grace** to man poured out as a deluge of blessings is for the "praise of HIS glory."
- 8. **Blessings** celebrated in the opening Hymn are the main **themes** in the rest of the book, subjects like: adoption/God's family; the gospel and its reception; holiness of life as God's purpose; Divine love becomes the Christian model; God's wisdom and insight revealed in "the mystery of His will," is now a blessing for God's children to know! These are all the basis for the worthy walk! (After all He's done for me ... How can I do less than ... live for Him completely)
- **B.** A Helpful Way to Be <u>Strong</u> in the LORD: <u>Prepared</u> and <u>Equipped</u> for **Christ:**
 - 1. Make this wonderful text a focus of personal study for several coming weeks
 - 2. Pray Psa. 119:18. Memorize a phrase a day, then ponder it; write down new thoughts & questions, connect other verses to it. Share the joys with others.
