The Kingdom of God: Jesus Christ's Millennial Reign Revelation 20:1-10

Amillennialism – NO earthly kingdom Postmillennialism – NO earthly Reign of Christ. 'Post': Christ's return is at the end <u>Premillennialism</u> – A 1000 year EARTHLY Reign of Christ

- **1.** 1 Corinthians 15:25-26, "For <u>He [Jesus Christ] must reign</u> until He has put all His enemies under His feet. The <u>last enemy</u> to be destroyed is <u>death</u>."
 - Rev. 20:4 Jesus' 1000 year reign
 - Rev 20:14 Finally, at the last, <u>death</u> and hades thrown into the Lake of Fire
- **2.** 1 Corinthians 15:22-24, "For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at <u>His coming</u> those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when <u>He delivers the kingdom to God the Father</u> after destroying every rule and every authority and power."
 - Rev. 20:4 The resurrection of all those who belong to Jesus: at His coming
 - Rev. 21:1 22:5; In the Eternal Kingdom, the Throne is a shared throne: "the throne of God and of the Lamb." (22:1, 3; cf. also, 21:22)
- **3.** At the end of the 1000 year reign of Christ (i.e., the millennium), who are these in verses 7-9 that assemble themselves against Christ and His kingdom?

"The Scriptures are clear that in the millennium ther will be the resurrected, glorified saints both of the Old Testament time and of the church age who will be associated with the Lord Jesus in His reign over the earth, as well as the unglorified subjects of the kingdom."
