- 2) When Paul comes for the third time to Corinth, what will be his attitude toward those he has warned and who have not yet repented of sin? (13:2)
- 3) What had the Corinthians been seeking from Paul? (13:3)
- 4) Paul said that he would deal with those who remained unrepentant by the power of whom? (13:4)
- 5) For those still comfortable living in their sin and unrepentant, Paul exhorts them to ‘*examine themselves*’ for what purpose? (13:5)
- 6) Paul said regardless of what the Corinthians thought of him, he prayed they would not do what is wrong, but they would do what? (13:7)
- 7) Paul wrote to the Corinthians “*For we can do nothing against the truth, but only _____.*” (13:8)
- 8) Paul was glad when he was weak and the Corinthians were strong. What does Paul desire for them? (13:9)
- 9) Paul said he was writing strong and stern words while away, so that when he is present he will not need to use his apostolic what? (13:10)
- 10) Paul said he received this apostolic authority (or power) from whom? (13:10)
