- 1) What did Moses place over his face in the presence of the Israelites? (3:13)
- 2) In Paul's day, whose minds were still blinded by a veil when the Old Testament Scriptures were read? (3:13-14)
- 3) What does Paul say was the cause of the veil and their blindness? (3:14)
- 4) Who can remove the veil from the hearts and minds of the Jewish people? (3:14-16)
- 5) What exists where the spirit of the Lord is? (3:17)
- 6) By the indwelling Spirit, followers of Jesus behold His glory and then are then transformed, little by little, into whose image? (3:18)
- 7) Name all that Paul renounced because of his God-given ministry. (4:1-2)
- 8) Because Paul had the ministry of the gospel, how did he *not* handle the word of God? (4:2)
- 9) What is the desperate condition of those whose hearts are blind to the gospel? (4:3)
- 10) Who has blinded the minds of them which believe not? (4:4)

- 11) What light does 'the god of this world' try to keep from the unbelievers of this world? (4:4)
- 12) Who is the image of God in verse 4:4? (4:4)
- 13) Who was the subject of Paul's preaching? (4:5)
- 14) When Paul preached Christ and represented himself as a servant for whose sake does he do this? (4:5)
- 15) In creation God commanded light to shine in the darkness, where else does Paul say that God causes light to shine? (4:6)
- 16) When God's light shines in the hearts of man what truth is revealed? (4:6)
- 17) Paul writes that the glory of God is seen in the face of whom? (4:6)
- 18) To the Corinthians Paul wrote that he, and those with him, were "always bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus." Give his reason for this. (4:10)
